ELIGIBILITY

Applicants for this scholarship will be required to meet the CCES admission standards, have substantial financial need, as well as be of an ethnic or racial minority group. Applicants must also meet some of the following criteria:

- **Academic excellence**
as demonstrated by standardized test scores, report cards or transcripts, teachers' recommendations, and CCES admission tests.
- **Additional evidence of merit**
as demonstrated by extra-curricular activities (e.g., arts, debate, science competitions, mock trial, student publications, leadership positions).
- **Motivation to succeed**
as demonstrated through personal interviews with the Cavalier Scholarship Committee.

ONGOING SUCCESS

- Once a student is awarded a Cavalier Scholarship, he or she will retain that scholarship through graduation, contingent on acceptable academic progress.
- Faculty and school administrators will work with each scholarship recipient to facilitate the transition to CCES through close communication.
- Cavalier Scholars will receive individual course planning with the Upper School Dean of Students and college counselors. The program of study includes a wide array of AP classes and an IB Diploma curriculum.
- These students will work closely with their Advisor, the Director of Diversity, the Dean of Students, the Senior Chaplain, and the Director of Service Learning to ensure a smooth transition into the CCES community.
- Supplies and equipment necessary for successful matriculation may be funded by the Cavalier Scholars Program.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

- Interested students can apply via the specific application for this award, available online and through the Admission Office. There is no application or admission fee required to apply. Applications are due by April 15, 2011.
- Families should submit financial information to the Business Office via the SSS (School and Student Services) website, sss.nais.org.
- All applicants will be invited to sit for a competitive exam created by our faculty, focusing on math, reading comprehension, and general knowledge, and requiring responses to two essay prompts.
- Based on the application and the results of the competitive exam, each finalist will be selected and invited to sit for an interview with the Cavalier Scholarship Committee.
- The Cavalier Scholar will be notified in writing if he or she is selected.
